Kingston, N. S., 44°59'N, 64°57'W (all points within a 24-km diameter, centre intersection of Bridge and Main Streets in Kingston, as described in 1969, to include Margaretsville, Dempsey Corners, Aylesford, Nicholsville, South Tremont, Nictaux Falls, and Middleton;).

Conditions: -28 December 2009, 06:00 - 17:30. Temperature -2 to $+6^{\circ}$ C. Wind S, 10-18 km / h. Snow 0-8 cm deep. Still water mostly frozen, moving water mostly open. A.M cloudy; p.m., mainly sunny.

Observer effort: 111 observers, 22* in field in 9 parties (daytime), and 89 at 56 feeders. Time and distance: 313.5 hours* at feeding stations, 0.75 hour and 2 km owling; total field party-hours 65.5* (day), and party-km 780.5* (day) (25.0 hr.* and 30 km on foot, and 40.5 hr. and 750.5 km* by car).
